The Planned Parenthood Association of Thailand under the Patronage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Mother (PPAT) is a non-profit organization, a leading sexual and reproductive health (SRH) learning agency supporting population's quality of life to sustainable development. PPAT's main goals are to advocate for policy and framework on sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), to increase access of population in Thailand to quality sexual and reproductive health services and to campaign for SRHR knowledge dissemination covering every corner of Thailand.

In 2020, PPAT implemented 22 projects, aiming to improve quality of lives of population in all age groups with respect to the current population's situation and advocate on sexual and reproductive health and rights continuously. PPAT was able to reach out to 3,200,000 target populations throughout the country with funding support from local and international agencies in total of 109,491,882 Baht. The details of 2021 implementation according to PPAT Strategic Plan 2017 – 2022 are as followed;



Outcome 1 Not less than 7 political organizations, government agencies, private organizations and civil society organizations support sexual and reproductive rights, reproductive health service, in particular family planning, STIs and HIV prevention, and quality, friendly and gender-equality counseling and reproductive health services

In 2020, there were 5 agencies supported PPAT's implementation to promote SRHR issues in following programmes;

- 1. The Department of Children and Youth, Ministry of Social Development and Human Security has supported the implementation of The Project Readiness of Children and Youth in Foster Home to Outside Society (2018 2021) and signed the MOU on the cooperation to improve children and youth works in Youth Welfare Centers under the Ministry by having policies on opening foster home and preparing every aspect of children before they are entering society.
- 2. Chiang Dao Wittayakom school and Sueksasongkroah Chiang Dao Wittayakom school in Chiang Dao district as well as Mae Aye Wittayakom school and Ratchaprachanukroah 30 school in Mae Aye district have cooperated and supported the implementation of 'Empowering Community Networks to Promote Adolescent Health in Chiang Dao and Mae Aye, Chiang Mai' project by signing the MOU with the role of moving forward the implementation on the prevention and solution mechanism of unplanned pregnancy and STIs in children and teenager in school.



PPAT also continued working to advocate for support on SRHR policy and implementation as well as increase opportunity and accessibility to receive SRHR services through PPAT projects. For example;

PPAT worked with partners and 5 welfare centers to implement *The Project Readiness of Children and Youth in Foster Home to Outside Society* which are Pakret Welfare Center for Boys, Pattani Welfare Center, Ratchasima Welfare Center for Boys and Udonthani Welfare Center for Girls in which the knowledge dissemination activities were conducted in accordance with '8 manuals (4 systems)' consisting with

- 1.) Life Learning
- 2.) Physical and Mental Health Care
- 3.) Creative and Recreational activity
- 4.) Education and Career

According to the evaluation of the research team from Population and Social Research, Mahidol University, it is found that children and youth in welfare centers have obvious changes in which they have become more disciplined, assertive, outspoken, confident, concentrative and less aggressive as well as having more leadership skill, life goal and readiness for education and career.

Outcome 2 Not less than 100,000 adolescents have knowledge on sexuality, sexual health, and appropriate sexual relations which will prevent and solve problems of unplanned pregnancy among teenagers



PPAT has developed the media to promote and support young people to access comprehensive sexuality education and sexual rights in order for them to have appropriate sexual behaviors and be able to prevent adolescent unplanned pregnancy by creating Peer Leaders to disseminate knowledge and advice in Peer-to-Peer format, developing appropriated media towards general youth and youth with disability as well as organizing training sessions to extend the results to 7,002 teenagers and disseminating knowledge through various types of media. The details are as followed:

- © Public media such as radio and television broadcasting to 2,470,000 audiences. (98.80% of the target of 2,500,000)
- © Campaign activity and print media such as brochure and poster to 27,685 persons. (12% of the target of 222,800 persons)
- Social media such as PPAT website, Facebook, Line, Instagram, Youtube, Twitter, Line@Happy Family by PPAT, Application "Pong Gun Dai" for 25,296,808 times of engagement. (252% of the target of 10,035,000 times)



The Project on Knowledge Dissemination for Improvement Quality of Life disseminated SRHR knowledge and information and PPAT's activities through various channels of media. The details are as followed:

- PPAT's president attended in television broadcasting "Wan Mai Variey" and "Khao Tiang 25" to talk about domestic violence and covid-19 situation with, approximately, 2,000,000 viewers.
- ⊕ Radio broadcasting in 28 stations with, approximately, 400,000 listeners.
- ⊕ Print media such as brochure, poster and family journal to 7,514 persons.
- ® Social Media such as PPAT website, Instagram, Twitter, Youtube, Video, infographic, Application "Pong Gun Dai", Line@Happy Family By PPAT, Facebook and Facebook Live talking about SRHR and family planning by PPAT's treasurer and medical specialist from Siriraj Hospital in which there are 24,108,616 times of social media engagement.











In addition, as 2020 is PPAT 50th anniversary, thereby, PPAT has conducted special activities including;

- ② Provided free of charge services in 9 clinics in which there were 330 blister packs of contra ceptive pills and 1,668 condoms distribution as well as 440 receivers of pep smear
- © Distributed 'Piem Suke' bags and medical supplies to 200 persons in Tak Bai district, Narathiwat province and delivered 250 Piem Suke bags to 5 PPAT clinics in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khonkaen and Ubon Ratchathani
- © Conducted Hall of Fame exhibition in order for the reminiscence of those who have patronaged PPAT
- © Conducted short video publicizing PPAT 50th Anniversary in social media
- Published PPAT 50th Anniversary journal in Thai and English
- Produced 50th Anniversary polo shirt and mask
- ② Set-up 50th Anniversary symbol standee in front of the building
- ② Attached 50th Anniversary symbol see through sticker within PPAT building





In the second period of *the Project HIV Prevention Promotion among Youths in Education Institutes,* PPAT disseminated knowledge through 'Guan Teen' program which is providing information and understanding on SRHR, safe sexual behavior, STIs and HIV/AIDS as well as responsibility on sexual intercourse to 462 youths in 6 educational institutes. Moreover, PPAT promoted students, especially those who had vulnerability and passed the screening, to acknowledge the importance of HIV prevention in which there were 28 persons who received STIs and HIV prevention services.





Under the Project Promoting Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights knowledge to Youths with Disabilities, PPAT conducted media to promote SRHR consisting with 4,500 braille books, with bas-relief images about rights, in general, sexual desire and SRHR of people with disability as well as videos on condom use, to general youth and deaf youth, through website: www.dek-d.com in order to provide basic life skill knowledge and SRHR skills for youth with disability wherein there were 200,000 times of engagement. Moreover, PPAT conducted 1-3 minutes length animation about youth with disability rights to access to information and news, SRHR services and sexual rights in order to raise awareness to the people.






In the Project HIV/STIs and Unplanned Pregnancy Prevention in Non-Formal Education Center, Chiang Rai province, PPAT cooperated with network organizations in Chiang Rai to conduct campaign activity "Love with safe and responsibility" on the Valentine's day to raise awareness about quality pregnancy, STIs and youth friendly service to youth in school and non-formal education as well as conducted Peer Leaders training session "Chiang Rai Non-Formal Education Learning and Understanding HIV/AIDS, STIs and Unplanned Pregnancy" for the acknowledgement of the importance of HIV and STIs prevention as well as unplanned pregnancy in order for the Peer Leaders to understand and accept that, not only young people, but, every group of population could be at risk of HIV. Furthermore, after the training session, Peer Leaders had expanded the knowledge to their friends, families and communities in which PPAT had distributed brochures and condoms to Peer Leaders for further distribution.





Through the Project Empowering Community Networks to Promote Comprehensive Adolescent Health in Chiang Dao and Mae Aye, Chiang Mai, PPAT implemented and pushed forward Act For Prevention And Solution Of The Adolescent Pregnancy Problem, B.E. 2559 (2016) in target areas with the cooperation from families, schools and communities in order for the 10-19 year-old youths to be able to access to SRHR knowledge and information of the importance of physical and mental health and risk behavior prevention as well as adolescent healthcare mechanism creation and prevention and solution of adolescent holistic health in educational institutes and communities. In addition, Chiang Dao and Mae Aye district working groups were officially set-up, by the chair person of the project, in which the working groups strengthened and connected the implementation between local organizations, including public health facility, educational institute, family and community in order to make the benefit to the target group in accordance with the project objectives.

Moreover, 4 target schools cooperated and supported the project by signing the MOU with the role of moving forward the implementation on the prevention and solution mechanism of unplanned pregnancy and STIs in children and teenager in school.



PPAT continued providing SRH counselling services to general population and vulnerable groups which are, adolescents, female sex workers, men who have sex with men, trans women, migrant workers, ethnic groups, people with disability and ageing population in target areas of **79,341 persons** (which is 176% of 2020's target of 45,000 persons) as well as providing family planning services in accordance with target groups' needs for 350,003 times (which is 168% of 2020's target of 221,000 times) through 10 PPAT clinics and projects in 2020.





Through 10 PPAT clinics in Bangkok (Din Daeng, Bang Khen and Pin klao), Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen, Ubon Ratchathani, Hat Yai and Phuket, PPAT provided information, knowledge and SRHR services under the Project on Family Planning and Reproductive Health Integration Services to all age groups of people, in particular to adolescent, accordingly to target groups' needs in which there were 17,859 clinic recipients. In addition, 5 PPAT clinics, which are Din Daeng, Bang Khen, Hat Yai, Chiang Mai and Chiang Rai, enrolled as service provision units under National Health Security Office scheme in order to provide and promote accessible health care services to people in which there were 118 persons who received services under social security healthcare.



In the Project Promotion of HIV Testing and AIDS Treatment Services among Migrant Workers, PPAT cooperated with network partners, from both private and government sectors, to encourage target groups to have knowledge and understanding about STIs and HIV prevention, basic worker rights and appropriate practice guideline through knowledge dissemination activity "Health Center for Migrant Community" and conducted medical mobile unit in order for the convenience of the migrant workers to access to knowledge and HIV test services. There were 2,213 recipients of HIV test and 21 of them were referred to Myawaddy Hospital, Myanmar, to receive further treatment.







Under the Project Promotion of HIV testing and AIDS treatment Service among Vulnerable Groups in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen and Bangkok, PPAT provided HIV and STIs test, counselling services and protections, such as condom and lubricant, to target groups, MSM and youth in project areas, which are educational institute, service establishment, private company, industrial plant and provincial jail. There were in total of 2,322 persons who received HIV and syphilis test in which 18 persons were HIV positive and 6 persons were syphilis positive. They received advices and referred to the hospital for further treatment.





Through the Project Improving Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) of Workers in Latex Factories and Rubber Plantations in Baan Na San and Kanchanadit districts, Surat Thani Province, Thailand, PPAT with network partners, from private and government sectors, established Drop-in Center within rubber latex buying spot, rubber storage factory, rubber baked factory and community to disseminate knowledge on family planning, pap smear, antenatal care and STIs/HIV test as well as distribute condom and lubricant by Thai and Myanmar Peer Educators. There were 861 Thai, Myanmar and Laotian workers who received knowledge in which PPAT distributed 727 blister packs of contraceptive pills, 25,426 pieces of condom and 973 tubes of lubricant. In addition, PPAT cooperated with Baan Na San Hospital and Kanchanadit Hospital for medical mobile unit provision in order to diagnose common disease and cervical cancer as well as distributed contraceptive pills, condoms and lubricants to 505 beneficiaries.





In the Promotion of HIV testing and AIDS treatment services among MSM/TG in Bangkok Project, PPAT provided proactive services to 4 target educational institutes in Bangkok areas with MSM Peer Leaders through various forms of media, such as sexual behavior card game, condom use exercise and STIs images, in order to disseminate knowledge on HIV and STIs to 180 persons in MSM group. In addition, there were 98 persons who received STIs and HIV tests, in which 7 of them were referred to further treatment as they were tested positive. Moreover, PPAT followed-up MSM group to re-receive HIV test in order for them to remain negative result.



Through HIV Prevention Service for Female Sex Workers in Chiang Mai Province project, PPAT collaborated with Hang Dong and Mae Aorn district health promotion hospital and local company to conduct medical mobile unit in order to disseminate knowledge and advice on AIDS, tuberculosis, hepatitis, STIs, cervical cancer and breast cancer as well as female sexual wellbeing. There were 225 persons who received HIV and syphilis test, 222 persons who received pap smear service, breast cancer screening and gonorrhea and chlamydia screening as well as 193 persons were followed-up to re-receive HIV test in order for them to remain negative result.





Outcome 4 PPAT's organizational structure, management system and personnel are effective and efficient as a learning organization with volunteerism

PPAT aimed to build capacity of personnel to have expertise and pleasure work as NGOs with pride, develop organization to be learning organization, quality organization and self-reliance organization, and restructure organization and management system to be updated and appropriate. PPAT conducted **Organization and Resource Development Project** which covers 3 main aspects;





- 1. Supporting social enterprise to increase implementation efficiency and income of PPAT for self-reliance by;
- 1.1 Establishing quality and safe Elderly Care Center with reasonable service fee in order to be responsive towards the needs of elders and to promote access to SRH service among all populations to improve quality of life of population which is the core of PPAT's value.
- 1.2 Strengthening PPAT staff and Volunteers' capacities on SRHR knowledge and skills in which there were 31 PPAT staff who attended trainings and workshops with other agencies, in Thailand and abroad, in total of 71 times and 656 volunteers of PPAT had knowledge and skills to support PPAT's implementation.
- 2. Developing planning, monitoring and evaluation for implementation in every quarter to improve organization's efficiency and effectiveness, as well as developing proposals to submit for funding from local and international agencies, in total of 12 projects.
- 3. Organizational management according to PPAT Strategic Plan which will be conformed to the current situation for the effectiveness and efficiency of implementation. The outcomes are separated according to each taskforce, the details are as followed;
