

The Planned Parenthood Association of Thailand under the Patronage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Mother (PPAT) is a non-profit organization, a leading sexual and reproductive health (SRH) learning agency supporting population's quality of life to sustainable development, with 52 years establishment. PPAT's main goals are to advocate for policy and framework on sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), to increase access of population in Thailand to quality sexual and reproductive health services and to campaign for SRHR knowledge dissemination covering every corner of Thailand.

In 2021, PPAT still determined to improve population's quality of life through 25 projects by improving the activity format in accordance with the Covid-19 prevention measures. PPAT was able to reach out to 1,500,000 target populations throughout the country with funding support from local and international agencies in total of 98,103,967 Baht, in order to promote SRHR information and service accessibility as well as healthcare service to all groups of people. The details of 2021 implementation according to PPAT strategic Plan 2017 – 2022 are as follows:

Outcome 1



Not less than 7 political organizations, government agencies, private organizations, civil society organizations support sexual and reproductive rights, reproductive health service, in particular family planning, STIs and HIV prevention, and quality, friendly and gender-equality counselling and reproductive health services

In 2021, there were 5 agencies supported PPAT's implementation to promote SRHR issues in following programmes;

1. The Department of Children and Youth, Ministry of Social Development and Human Security has supported the implementation of the Project 'Readiness of Children and Youth in Foster Home to Outside Society (2018 – 2021)' and signed the MOU on the cooperation to improve children and youth works in Youth Welfare Centers under the Ministry by having policies on opening foster home and preparing every aspect of children before they are entering society.



2. Chiang Dao Wittayakom school and Sueksasongkroah Chiang Dao Wittayakom school, in Chiang Dao district, as well as Mae Aye Wittayakom school and Ratchaprachanukroah 30 school, in Mae Aye district, have cooperated and supported the implementation of 'Empowering Community Networks to Promote Adolescent Health in Chiang Dao and Mae Aye, Chiang Mai' project by signing the MOU with the role of moving forward the implementation on the prevention and solution mechanism of unplanned pregnancy and STIs in children and teenagers in school.



PPAT also continued working to advocate for support on SRHR policy and implementation as well as increase opportunity and accessibility to receive SRHR services through PPAT projects. For example;

PPAT worked with partners and 5 welfare centers to implement The Project Readiness of Children and Youth in Foster Home to Outside Society, which are Pakret Welfare Center for Boys, Chiang Mai Welfare Center for Boys, Pattani Welfare Center, Ratchasima Welfare Center for Boys and Udon Thani Welfare Center for Girls, in which the knowledge dissemination activities were conducted, by in and out personnel of welfare center, to 652 children and youths in accordance with '8 manuals (4 systems)' consisting with

- 1.) General Life skills strengthening activity
- 2.) Specific Life skills strengthening activity
- 3.) Sexuality Education an SRHR activity
- 4.) Counselling activity
- 5.) Homeroom activity
- 6.) Mindfulness in Organization activity
- 7.) Creative and Recreational activity
- 8.) Education and Career activity.

The outcomes show that children and youths are more open about their feelings and have more trust towards the caretaker as well as have more critical thinking skill, writing skill, working skill and understanding about gender roles which can be applied in their life



Through The Project Quality of Life Improvement, Tak Bai district, Narathiwas province, PPAT promoted Khok Nong Na Project Peer Leaders, Teacher Peer Leaders and Student Peer Leaders of Bann Salamai school to have. and capable of disseminating, knowledge on SRHR, Sexuality Education, family planning and environmental health to their neighbors and local schools in the areas. Teens in community increasingly recognized the importance of SRHR, had less sexual risky behavior, concerned about their well-being, equipped with solving skill and had fine living attitude as well as skilled in EM making to use in gardening and school and household cleaning. The EM helps to reduce expense and chemical use in household and school as well as make the benefit of the local resources, for example, using lime and pineapple, planted by the locals, to produce the EM.



Under The Project Changing Sexual Harassment against Women in Education Institutions in Bangkok, PPAT selected women and girls in education institutes, activists and other individuals, whom had been affected by sexual harassment, who wished to make a change and engage in movement to end sexual harassment in education institutes. The project was publicized through social media by conducting the end sexual harassment advocacy key message contest as well as nominated names/introduced activists from related agencies. In addition, PPAT cooperated with a researcher to conduct KAP Survey (Knowledge, Attitude and Practice Survey) to study knowledge, attitude, experience and behavior in relation with sexual harassment of Panyapiwat Technological College's students. The data would be used to conduct activity, raise awareness and promote gender equality as well as create the right attitude and behavior, among students, in order to end sexual harassment in education institutes and Thai society.



Not less than 100,000 adolescents have knowledge on sexuality, sexual health and appropriate sexual relations which will prevent and solve problems of unplanned pregnancy among teenagers

PPAT developed media in various channels to reach the target groups during the Covid-19 pandemic in order to promote and raise awareness on Sexuality Education and SRHR with the focus on proper sexual behavior and adolescent pregnancy prevention by creating Peer Leaders and improving their knowledge and ability to be capable of disseminating knowledge and advice in Peer-to-Peer format. In addition, PPAT also developed media for general youths and youths with disability as well as the training to 13,879 teens. The details of the media dissemination are as follows:

Public media such as radio and television broadcasting to 1,091,053 audiences. (495.26% of the target of 220,300 audiences)

Campaign activity and printing media such as brochures and posters to 41,170 persons. (15.25% of the target of 270,000 persons)

Social media such as PPAT website, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, Twitter,Line@Happy family by PPAT, Application "Pong Gun Dai" for 5,023,053 times of engagement. (109.78% of the target of 4,575,650 times)



The Project on Knowledge Dissemination for Improvement Quality of Life disseminated SRHR and sexual health information as well as PPAT activity through various channels of the media. The details are as follows:

Television broadcasting; the news program of channel One31, interviewed PPAT regarding women's SRHR which able to reach approximately, 656,053 viewers.

Radio Broadcasting in 25 stations to, approximately, 435,000 listeners.

Printing media such as brochures, posters and journals to 22,465 persons.

Social media such as PPAT website, Instagram, Twitter, YouTube, Application "Pong Gun Dai" and Line@Happy family by PPAT, Facebook, Facebook Live talking about SRHR and family planning by PPAT council members, specialist physicians from Siriraj Hospital and Finance and Relationship specialists in which there were 5,010,987 times of social media engagement.





In the third period of the Project HIV Prevention Promotion among Youths in Education Institutes. PPAT conducted communication skill development workshop to Teacher Peer Leaders in 5 schools to increase knowledge on HIV/AIDS and STIs as well as communication and consultation skill. Furthermore, the mandala activity was conducted to develop teaching skill in which IEC materials 'Positive Communication with Teens' were distributed to Teacher Peer Leaders in order for them to be able to apply the skill in their teachings as well as conduct the assistance plan for vulnerable youths, by using the screened information from 'Guan Teen' program.



Under the second expanded period of the Elderly and Healthy Environment Project, Pattani Province, PPAT cooperated with the local trained elders to disseminate knowledge and advice to neighbors, in total of 450 households, about family and community environmental health, non-chemical gardening and waste sorting as well as EM using promotion to reduce chemical use in household and community. The results show that the neighbors use EM for cleaning in regular basis in which Elderly Peer Leaders and members are proud from being able to disseminate knowledge, contribute beneficial matters towards community and influence their elderly neighbors.

Through the Project Empowering Community Networks to Promote Adolescent Health in Chiang Dao and Mae Aye, Chiang Mai, PPAT has built the engagement with government sectors, private agencies, network partners and youth by establishing Provincial and District Consultant Committees, which is a mechanism of adolescent unplanned pregnancy and SRH prevention and solution in 7 subdistricts of Chiang Dao district and 7 subdistricts of Mae Aye district, Chiang Mai. The implementation was led by the Teen Power team to disseminate knowledge and advice through onsite training, face-to-face counselling, Facebook page and radio broadcasting to more than 4,000 youths. In addition, Teen Mom Peer Leaders conducted home visit activity to teen moms after birth giving, whom have health problems and live in remote areas, in order to perform the health assessment for teen moms and babies as well as refer them to receive further treatment in Hospitals and Subdistrict Health Promotion Hospitals, in total of more than 200 persons.





In The Project Covid-19 Prevention and Care Accessibility to Most At-Risk Populations, PPAT set-up the project taskforce to conduct the implementation direction in accordance with blind people's lifestyle as well as study their needs during the Covid-19 pandemic to propose the appropriate service format to them. In addition, the communication training in Peer-to-Peer format for 20 blind volunteers and caretakers was conducted in order for them to be able to disseminate knowledge and advice to other groups of people with disability, who are in need, by promoting the volunteers to conduct knowledge dissemination activity, in Lam Luk Ka, Thanyaburi and Khlong Luang district, Pathumthani, and make a convenience, to 36 blind persons, to receive the service, through phone call and home visit activity to encourage the target groups to obtain knowledge and friendly service. Moreover, 7 audio stories were produced in the project to provide useful information. The audio was disseminated through accessible channels for blind persons, namely, 1414 hotline call center and Line application, in which the audio stories would be started to disseminate through online platform to increase more choices for blind persons.






Targeted population, particularly disadvantaged group, not less than 500,000 persons have knowledge and understanding on sexual and reproductive health, STIs and HIV infection prevention, have access to quality and friendly reproductive health services, be able to take of their health and live happily

PPAT continued providing SRH counselling services to general population and vulnerable groups, which are, adolescents, female sex workers, men who have sex with men, trans women, migrant workers, ethnic groups, people with disability and ageing population in target areas of 34,430 persons (125.20% of 2021's target of 27,500 persons) as well as providing family planning services in accordance with target groups' needs for 253,719 times (105.19% of 2021's targets of 241,200 times) through 10 PPAT clinics and projects in 2021.





Through 10 PPAT clinics in Bangkok (Din Daeng, Bang Khen and Pin Klao), Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen, Ubon Ratchathani, Hat Yai and Phuket, PPAT provided information, news and SRHR services under the Project on Family Planning and Reproductive Health Integration Services to all age groups of people, in particular to adolescent, according to target groups' needs in which there were 19,785 recipients. In addition, 6 PPAT clinics, which are Din Daeng, Bang Khen, Hat Yai, Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai and Lampang, enrolled as service provision under National Health Security Office scheme in order to provide and promote accessible healthcare services to people in which there were 447 persons who received the services under social security healthcare. In addition, with the Covid-19 pandemic, PPAT has piloted the telemedicine service in Hat Yai clinic to provide the service to the recipients who cannot travel across provinces. There were 220 recipients of telemedicine service in year 2021.

Under the Project Promotion of HIV Testing and AIDS Treatment Services among Migrant Workers in Mae Sot district, Tak province, and the Project Promotion HIV Testing and AIDS Treatment Service among Vulnerable Groups in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen and Bangkok,





PPAT promoted the target groups to have knowledge and understanding about HIV and STIs prevention, basic labor rights and guidance with the collaboration of network partners from government sectors and local private agencies to organize knowledge dissemination activity in Healthcare Center for Migrant Workers as well as conduct medical mobile unit service provision in order for the migrant workers to be able to access to information and HIV test service. There were 1,087 migrant workers who received the service in which 3 of them were referred to receive further treatment in Myawaddy Hospital, Myanmar.

In addition, PPAT also provided advice and HIV and STIs test as well as distributed condoms and lubricants through the medical mobile unit service to vulnerable target groups, which are adolescent/youth, MSM, female sex workers and prisoners in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen and Bangkok's schools, service establishment, private company, industrial plant and prison. There were 1,388 persons who received HIV and Syphilis test in which the staff provided advice and referred 15 persons who were HIV positive and 15 persons who were syphilis positive to receive further treatment at the hospitals.





Through the Project Improving Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) of Workers in Latex Factories and Rubber Plantations in Baan Na San and Kanchanadit districts, Surat Thani Province, Thailand, PPAT established Drop-in Center around the communities, of rubber latex buying spot, rubber storage plant, latex factory and rubber plantation, to be a knowledge dissemination center of family planning, pap smear, antenatal care, STIs, HIV and condoms and lubricants distribution through Thai and Myanmar volunteers. With the collaboration with Baan Na San Hospital and Kanchanadit Hospital to conduct medical mobile unit service provision, there were 522 Thais, Myanmars and Laotians who received knowledge and 594 persons who received common disease diagnosis and pap smear in which there were 662 contraceptive pills blister packs, 26,664 condoms and 672 lubricants distribution.



In the Project HIV Prevention for MSM/Transgender in Educational Institutes in Bangkok and the Project HIV Prevention Service for Female Sex Workers in Chiang Mai, Khon Kaen, Nonthaburi and Pathumthani Provinces, PPAT collaborated with local hospitals and public health office in the area to conduct medical mobile unit service to provide proactive service by disseminating knowledge and advice on AIDS, tuberculosis, hepatitis, STIs, cervical cancer and breast cancer as well as women's health. In addition, PPAT publicized other channels to receive the service, such as public and private medical service units in the project areas in order for the convenience of the target groups. As a result, there were 475 female sex workers and 125 MSMs who have received HIV and syphilis test in which 294 persons were followed-up, after 3 months of testing, to retest and retain the negative result.





Under the Project Bann Horm Lamduan Elderly Care Center, in order to provide the service to dependent elderly persons, PPAT constructed and decorated the center, purchased medical supplies and recruited Elderly Care Center personnel as well as conducted the elderly care refreshment training for the preparation to provide 10 beds services in 2022. PPAT publicized the center through social media, which are PPAT website, Facebook (Facebook page: ศูนย์ดูแลผู้สูงอายุบ้าน หอมลำดวน) and Line Office Account as well as printing media, which are brochure, vinyl banner and roll-up. In addition, Bann Horm Lamduan Kitchen was operated to prepare for Elderly Care Center's recipients, PPAT staff and general public in which kitchen space and equipment were provided by PPAT.



Hotline Call Center 1452 was established by PPAT through the project Pilot End-to-End Referral System to Increase Female Migrants Workers' Access to Comprehensive Abortion Care to increase more accessible information on family planning and safe abortion care for female migrant workers, in 4 languages, which are Thai, Myanmar, Laotian and Cambodian, as well as refer the recipients to receive safe abortion care service in safe and friendly infirmaries. In addition, PPAT cooperated with the researchers to study their SRHR basic knowledge, attitude and behavior before starting the baseline study, in order to use the data in the project's planning and development. PPAT conducted Migrant Community Health Volunteers (MCHVs) training to 73 persons and promoted them to conduct 105 mini-focus groups training on SRHR, family planning and safe abortion care in migrant workers' community and resident in which there were 2,106 persons who had received the knowledge.

Outcome 4

PPAT's organizational structure, management system and personnel are effective and efficient as a learning organization with volunteerism

PPAT aimed to build capacity of personnel to have expertise and pleasure work as NGOs with pride, develop organization to be learning organization, quality organization and self-reliance organization, and restructure organization and management system to be updated and appropriate. PPAT conducted **Organization and Resource Development Project** which covers 4 main aspects;

- 1. Supporting Social Enterprise to increase implementation efficiency and income of PPAT for self-reliance by;
- 1.1 Selling contraceptive supplies, which are 375 blister packs of contraceptive pills, 12,816 condoms, 52 IUDs and 4 contraceptive implants.
- 1.2 Implementing Elderly Care Center Project to provide safe, quality and friendly one-stop service in response to the elders' needs as well as to promote SRHR service accessibility to all groups of people to improve quality of life of population which is the core of PPAT's value.
- 2. Developing planning, monitoring and evaluation for implementation in every quarter to improve organization's efficiency and effectiveness, as well as developing proposals to submit for funding from local and international agencies, in total of 17 projects.





- 3. Organizational management according to PPAT Strategic Plan, in order to revise organizational regulations, policies and implementation, which will be conformed to the current situation as well as integrating technologies for the benefits of the organizational development.
- 4. Strengthening PPAT staff and Volunteers' capacities on SRHR knowledge wherein the knowledge promotion was constantly exchanged in Project Management training 4.0 and Online Implementation Innovation Workshop in which there were 61 staff participating in SRHR Digital Communication Program Training and 641 volunteers of PPAT had knowledge and skills to support PPAT's implementation.







In addition, PPAT cooperated with national and international agencies by attending the meeting, 58 times, with government sector and civil society, which related to SRHR works, namely, Driving Strategy for Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention and Solution Subcommittee, Service System Development Subcommittee, Educational System Development Subcommittee, Quality and Friendly SRHR and Sexual Health Service System Development Taskforce, Driving Strategy for Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention and Solution Follow-up Taskforce and Roles Promotion of Family, Community and Organization to Create Relationship and Adolescent's Sexual Well-Being Communication Taskforce.





In the Project Knowledge, Perception, Attitude and Expectation towards Abortion in PPAT clinics' Recipients, PPAT conducted and proposed research topic "Knowledge, Perception, Attitude and Experience towards Abortion in PPAT Clinics' Recipients" to Research Ethic Committee (REC), Institute for Population and Social Research, Mahidol University for the review. The research was certified in December 2021 in which the research team. was scheduled to be trained and informed about project's overview, objectives, expected outcomes and techniques for qualitative research data collection as well as analyze the probability and characteristic of abortion recipients in each area.
