## A Message from President

2022 was the year that Thailand and every country all over the world started recovering from the Covid-19 pandemic and slowly returning to the pre-pandemic conditions. However, the disruption of normal international financial flows caused by the conflict between Ukraine and Russia, negatively impacted PPAT's funding activities and its ability to execute its annual plan.

These challenges forced PPAT to revise and adjust its 2022 annual plan, to account for the rapid change in global conditions, and people's behavior and lifestyle.

PPAT's mission is to improve quality of life of the general population, and to provide access to sexual reproductive health and rights without regard to age, gender, race, religion and sexual orientation. Further, PPAT is tasked with comprehensively enhancing healthcare service accessibility to all, in response to governmental policies aimed at improving the entire population's sexual health.

PPAT's programs are implemented in accordance with the Twelfth National Economic and Social Development Plan (2017), that aims to improve quality of life of population by "leaving no one behind". These programs are described, and implemented via PPAT's Strategic Plan 2017 – 2022, which is focused on the improvement of the overall population's quality of life, achieved in alignment with sustainability guidelines, with social environment priorities, and while protecting the cultural identity and priorities of all groups and minorities.



In 2022, PPAT implemented 26 projects that benefited more than 2 million people in the target population segments, across all age groups, and with special emphasis on marginalized and hard-to-reach people, people with vulnerabilities and disabilities, displaced people in border areas, and the elderly.

These achievements emphasize the determination, sacrifice and efforts of PPAT Council, members, volunteers and staff, as well as PPAT's network of partners from the private and public sectors, who have provided ongoing support to PPAT programs and objectives.

On this occasion, I would like to offer my gratitude to PPAT 17<sup>th</sup> Council, members, staff and public and private agencies, along with every volunteer who collectively have been the crucial driving force in pushing forward sexual and reproductive health work, and in achieving PPAT's objectives. And, finally, I wish to thank once again all of PPAT's supporters everywhere, for helping us harmoniously improve Thai population's quality of life.

This 52<sup>nd</sup> annual report of achievements marks the anniversary of the Planned Parenthood Association of Thailand under the Patronage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Mother (PPAT) strategic plan 2017 – 2022. PPAT is a non-profit organization, a leading sexual and reproductive Health (SRH) learning agency supporting Thailand’s population quality of life to sustainable development. PPAT’s core mission is to increase access to information, news and awareness on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights as well as unplanned pregnancy prevention towards key demographics of the population, especially marginalized groups. PPAT has collaborated with the government sector, civil society organizations and public agencies to create opportunities for friendly and safe sexual and reproductive health services, along with linking to local and international organizations to promote sexual and reproductive health and rights, comprehensive sexuality education and sexual health service accessibility.

In 2022, PPAT was fully recovered from the impacts of the Covid-19 outbreak and continues to implement 26 projects in accordance with our strategic plan 2017 – 2022, which emphasized the promotion of sexual and reproductive health and rights accessibility as well as the continuation of improving quality of life of populations. PPAT was able to reach to 2,000,000 of the target population throughout the country with funding support from local and international agencies in total of 112,011,131 Baht, under the proactive activity in the project areas and the responsive clinics as well as telemedicine services to enhance access for those with difficulties to receive the services.

PPAT is also collaborating with the government sector, civil society organizations and public agencies to promote sexual and reproductive health and rights information to all age groups. The details of 2022 implementation according to PPAT Strategic Plan 2017 – 2022 are as follows;

## Outcome 1



Outcome 1 Not less than 7 political organizations, government agencies, private organizations and civil society organizations support sexual and reproductive rights, reproductive health service, in particular family planning, STIs and HIV prevention, and quality, friendly and gender-equality counseling and reproductive health services.

In 2022, Panyapiwat Technology College supported and promoted sexual and reproductive and rights implementation of The Project Stop Sexual Harassment in Educational Institute in which PPAT cooperated with student activists in the college to raise awareness to stop sexual harassment, promote equality and the right attitude and behavior as well as engaged in the campaign activities to end sexual harassment in education institutes and Thai society. As a result, the educational institutes that participated have conducted solution, prevention and remedy protocols to the victims of sexual harassment accordingly.'

## The Project Readiness of Children and Youth in Foster Homes to Outside Society

has entered its third year of developing the welfare center's system under the 4 principles, to achieve best practices. The are: 1. Physical and Mental Health Care 2. Life Learning 3. Creational and Recreational Activity and 4. Education and Career. These systems can be adopted to use in the welfare centers appropriately in which PPAT has also supported internal and external personnel of the welfare center to conduct knowledge dissemination activities in accordance with '8 Manuals' and the trainers' interest and specialty as well as the children and youth in welfare centers' needs. There were 5 welfare centers that participated in the project: Pakret Welfare Center for Boys, Pattani Welfare Center, Ratchasima Welfare Center for Boys and Udon Thani Welfare Center for Girls. The results showed, that due to the continuous development, the program achieved the following positive outcomes:

- 1) Children and youth are ready to enter society with life skills, mindfulness and decent knowledge and behavior.
- 2) Welfare centers' personnel have continually conducted the activities as well as adopted the concept of Mindfulness in Organization (MIO) to be used in their organizations.
- 3) Welfare centers' have been continually developed and able to extend the results to other 11 welfare centers.



Through the Quality of Live Improvement, Tak Bai district, Narathiwat Province Project, PPAT conducted the knowledge dissemination training on Smart Farmer to Khok Nong Na project's volunteer leaders and supported them to conduct activity to their 8 neighboring villages including teacher leaders and peer leaders. The knowledge dissemination activities to Bann Salamai school involves topics on sexual and reproductive health, birth spacing, unplanned pregnancy, STIs and HIV/AIDS as well as EM making for household use, such as container washing, bathroom cleaning, laundering and non-chemical gardening. The above mentioned knowledge was also disseminated to community peers and villagers through Peer-to-Peer activities which became to be a foundation for EM Making Center in Bann Salamai school that was a role model for sustainable communities.



Under The Project Stop Sexual Harassment in Education Institute, PPAT with Panyapiwat Technology College's activists developed a key message through a seminar topic 'Don't Start, Don't Yield, Don't Tolerate', as well as conducted an activity called 'Q&A about sexual harassment'. In addition, a roleplay and booth activities were also arranged in order to invite the participants to think further regarding sexual harassment. This movement is to raise awareness and promote society to stop sexual harassment at Panyapiwat Technology College so the students acknowledge the importance of this social issue and beware of the sexual harassment problems around them whether it is in the form of gazing, touching, speaking or others.



## Outcome 2



Outcome 2 Not less than 100,000 adolescents have knowledge on sexuality, sexual health, and appropriate sexual relations which will prevent and solve problems of unplanned pregnancy among teenagers.

In 2022, PPAT enhanced our media output to be more aligned with the trends of the Thai youth and mainstream population to disseminate advice, information and news on sexual and reproductive health, sexuality education and adolescent unplanned pregnancy for all age groups of the population. Our aim is to create and develop peer leaders in the project areas to extend the projects' result in education institutes and communities to 14,884 teenagers and disseminate knowledge through various types of media. The details are as follows:

- Public media such as radio and television broadcasting to 2,500,000 listeners. (277.77% of 2022 target of 900,000 listeners)
- Campaign activity and print media such as brochures, posters and Family Journal to 676,500 persons. (135.30% of 2022 target of 500,000 persons)
- Social media such as PPAT website, Facebook, Line, Instagram, YouTube, Twitter, Line@Happy family by PPAT, Application "Pong Gun Dai" and Facebook Live for 5,628,599 times of engagement. (55.92% of 2022 target of 10,065,000 times)

PPAT implemented various projects to achieve the outcome 2 objectives These projects include:





The Project on Knowledge Dissemination for Improvement Quality of Live disseminated SRHR knowledge and information and PPAT activities through various channels of media, which were television broadcasting through channel ONE on the topic ‘Female Sexual and Reproductive Health’ and ‘World Contraception Day’, radio broadcasting in 25 stations, print media such as brochures, posters and Family Journal, animation and social media. In addition, PPAT cooperated with Bayer Thailand Company Limited to conduct knowledge dissemination activity to Thai farmers under the Project GROWTH: Grow Together which had 1,753 farmers from 13 districts, 9 provinces, participated in the project. The project disseminated knowledge on sexual and reproductive health, family planning, contraceptive and family- and self-care. Moreover, PPAT also provided suggestion and advise on SRHR through digital platform, Line OA: @grow\_th), to the farmers who joined the project.



PPAT implemented the **Project Covid-19 Prevention and Care Accessibility to Most At-Risk Population** in Bangkok, Nonthaburi, Pathumthani and Samut Prakan provinces to serve blind people. The project trained blind volunteers and caregivers to have knowledge and understanding on Covid-19 and how to pass over their knowledge in Peer-to-Peer format. In addition, PPAT encouraged the project participants to conduct home visit activity to disseminate knowledge and accommodate blind people as well as produce audio clips on necessary and current information to be publicized through hotline 1414 and Line application. Furthermore, PPAT was able to reach to female sex workers (FSW) and men who have sex with men (MSM) via distributing infographic and live streaming regarding HIV, STIs and how to take care of their health during the Covid-19 as well as publicize screening channels for HIV and STIs through social media platforms, Facebook Fan Page: FUN FACT HIV and Line Official FUN FACT HIV.



Through the Project the SRHR Knowledge an HIV Prevention Service Provision in Education Institutes in North Region, PPAT conducted a skill training and experience sharing activities among teacher leaders and peer leaders in 4 project areas, which were Lampoon, Chiang Rai, Chiang Mai and Lampang. PPAT also supported the trained teachers and students to disseminate knowledge on contraception, HIV/AIDS, STIs, sexual rights, equality, PrEP, PEP, U=U, pregnancy, depression and drugs use as well as referred teenagers and youths to receive the service in public infirmaries to undertake HIV screening, pregnancy test and depression treatment.



In the Project HIV Prevention Promotion Among Youths in Education Institutes, PPAT conducted a training on sexual health consultation skill and “Guan Teen” program training to the project teachers on how to integrate the program’s data to assist the students with different vulnerabilities. Additionally, students were also trained on the program to use for assessing their risky behavior such as risky sexual behavior, stress, drugs use and domestic violence. All the students that have attended the training were also advised on the solution to their problems in which the project teachers could utilize the assessment in their assistive plan for the students afterwards. PPAT conducted knowledge dissemination activity on comprehensive sexuality education, risky behavior that could lead to HIV and STIs infections and sexual rights in 5 education institutes in Bangkok as well as conducted a mobile unit service to provide HIV and STIs (syphilis) screening to youth in educational institutes.



Under the project Elderly and Healthy Environment Project, Pattani province, PPAT conducted a sub-group training to enhance capabilities and knowledge to elderly leaders and family members for them to be able to conduct home visits in the community themselves. The workshop was also conducted for each area representative, namely, elderly leaders, religious leaders, community leaders, public health volunteers and family members to promote environmental health, waste disposal, household cleaning and EM making in household such as container washing, bathroom cleaning and planting to reduce family expense within the community.



## Outcome 3

Outcome 3 Targeted population, particularly disadvantaged group, not less than 500,000 persons, have knowledge and understanding on sexual and reproductive health, STIs and HIV infection prevention, have access to quality and friendly reproductive health services, be able to take of their health and live happily.



PPAT continued promoting and increasing SRH knowledge and services accessibility to all groups of populations, namely, teenagers and youth, female sex workers (FSW), men who have sex with men (MSM), trans gender, migrant workers, indigenous group, people with disabilities and ageing population in target areas of 55,314 persons (which is 110.62% of 2022's target of 50,000 persons) as well as providing family planning services in accordance with target groups' needs for 303,770 times (which is 146.04% of 2022's target of 208,000 times) through 10 PPAT clinics, telemedicine services and projects;

Through 10 PPAT clinics in Bangkok (Din Daeng stopped providing the service as of August 12, 2022, in which Bang Khen and Pinklao are still open), 3 clinics in north region (Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai and Lampang), 2 clinics in northeast region (Khon Kaen and Ubon Ratchathani) and 2 clinics in south region (Hat Yai and Phuket), PPAT provided information, news and friendly and safe services under **the Project on Family Planning and Reproductive Health Integration Services** to 22,509 clinic recipients. In addition, 6 PPAT clinics, which are Din Daeng, Bang Khen, Hat Yai, Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai and Lampang, enrolled as service provision units under National Health Security Office scheme in order to provide and promote accessible healthcare services to people in which there were 701 persons who received contraceptive and family planning services.



In the **Project on Fisherman’s Life Enhancement Center**, PPAT conducted a teaching lesson at the Migrant Children Learning Center, Songkhla province, to 42 migrant workers’ children, aged 4 – 14 years old, as well as conducted an activity “Good Waste Has Value” wherein they could exchange recycle trash with necessary goods and provided consultation and assistance to the parents. Moreover, a field trip at Institute for Skill Development for children was highlighted as one of our activities where the children could learn how to cook by themselves in order to utilize it for their future career and income. PPAT with network partners collaborated in the campaign against child labor in the World Day Against Child Labor under the key message “I raise my hand for a world without child labor.”, with hashtags #RaiseYourHandsForKids #ฉันยกมือเพื่อโลกที่ปราศจากการใช้แรงงานเด็ก #ยกมือขึ้นเพื่อลูก.





Under the Project **Promotion of HIV Testing and AIDS Treatment Service among Vulnerable Groups in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen and Bangkok**, PPAT promoted HIV screening in Mae Sot district, Tak province, by providing the service at the Migrant Workers Health Center and mobile unit service, for Rapid HIV Test and common diagnosis, as well as disseminating knowledge, news and information and distributing condoms to 2,336 migrant workers along with referring the HIV positive recipients to receive further treatment at Myawaddy Hospital, Myanmar. This project has been implemented in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Lampang, Khon Kaen and Bangkok with the cooperation from PPAT, volunteers and local medical personnel to conduct knowledge dissemination activity on HIV/AIDS, STIs and condom use to the target groups in both online and onsite formats. PPAT also conducted a mobile unit service provision to provide HIV, STIs and syphilis screening, consultation and refer those who tested positive to receive proper treatment at the nearby service providers according to their rights. PPAT has reached to, in total of 1,705 persons of vulnerable groups, namely, teenagers and youths, female sex workers (FSW), men who have sex with men (MSM) and LGBTQIA+.



With the cooperation between PPAT, volunteers, hospitals and local public health offices to implement **the Project HIV Prevention Service for Female Sex Workers in Chiang Mai, Khon Kaen, Nonthaburi and Pathumthani Provinces**, the HIV prevention service accessibility has been increased. Despite providing the HIV and syphilis re-screening, we also disseminated knowledge through mobile unit service provision to, in total of, 329 persons of female sex workers (FSW), men who have sex with men (MSM) and trans gender to retain their negative result and refer those who tested positive to receive proper treatment afterwards.





In **Baan Hormlamduan Nursing Home**, PPAT was certified by the Ministry of Public Health to provide the service on March 28, 2022, for 10 beds, and the service was officially open on May 6, 2022, in which there were 9 elderly recipients, 8 long stay recipients and 1 short stay recipient. Baan Hormlamduan Nursing Home launched a promotion for VIP room in accordance with elderly types in which we provide standardized care in correspondence with Primary Health Care Division and Senior Health Service and Trade Association (SHATA) standards. PPAT also opened Baan Hormlamduan Kitchen to serve nutritious food for elderly recipients, and general food to PPAT staff, clinic recipients and general public in July 2022.



Within the **Project HIV Prevention Service for Female Sex Workers in Khon Kaen Province**, PPAT promoted SRH and integrative Covid-19 prevention knowledge, financial stability and self-appreciation to create beneficial options for female sex workers, with the support from project volunteers to conduct proactive activity of sub-group knowledge dissemination and provide HIV screening service in service establishments to 675 persons. Furthermore, PPAT also distributed condoms and contraception as well as empowered the recipients to see their worth and share their experiences on life, work, financial management, STIs prevention and how they handled the difficulties during the Covid-19 or hardship in life.



Through the **Project Pilot End-to-End Referral System to Increase Female Migrant Workers' Access in Comprehensive Abortion Care**, PPAT disseminated consultation regarding sexual and reproductive health, family planning, sexual health and unplanned pregnancy in 4 languages, Thai, Burmese, Laotian and Khmer through the hotline call center 1452 to 1,359 persons. There were 44 migrant workers who received the service at PPAT clinic by contacting hotline 1452. Moreover, PPAT conducted a training and supported Migrant Community Health Volunteers (MCHVs) to conduct 202 sessions of sub-group training around migrant workers' residents in which there were 4,037 migrant workers who received knowledge on SRHR, family planning, contraception and safe abortion care. The project was well cooperated by the related agencies, namely, migrant workers, industrial plants, public sectors and local civil society organizations in Samut Sakorn province.

PPAT has enhanced the service and information dissemination on sexual and reproductive health, sexuality education and family planning to telemedicine channel under **the Project Comprehensive Sexual and Reproductive Health Services through Telemedicine in South Region**. This project is implemented and piloted in Hat Yai clinic via Web App, which is an innovation that has emerged during the Covid-19 to serve those who are not able to travel due to the mobility restriction. In 2022, there were 481 persons who were interested to receive the service through Web App <https://ppat.clinic/>. The service is provided by the specialized practitioners and coordinators as well as staff who will assist the recipients throughout the process by adhering to the safety of the recipients.





**Outcome 4 PPAT's organizational structure, management system and personnel are effective and efficient as a learning organization with volunteerism.**

PPAT aimed to continue to build the capacity of the organization including skills training and providing a pleasurable working environment to work for a NGO with pride, develop and oversee projects, research, work with academia, to be learning organization, a quality organization and self-reliant organization as well as revise the organizational management in accordance with the strategic plan and more closely aligned to the world-wide environment and trends. PPAT conducted Organization and Resource Development through these projects below:

#### **4 Aspects of Organization and Resource Development project are,**

##### **1. Supporting social enterprise to increase PPAT income for future self-reliance by;**

1.1 Providing and selling contraceptive supplies, which are contraceptive pills, condoms, IUD and implant to hospital, company and general public.

1.2 Support Baan Hormlamduan Nursing Home implementation to be the holistic and standardized elderly care facility in accordance with Primary Health Care Division and Senior Health Service and Trade Association (SHATA) standard.

##### **3. Revising and developing organizational management to be accordance with the PPAT strategic plan;**

PPAT council has engaged in organizational management in terms of providing ideas, suggestions and feedback that are beneficial to PPAT as well as connecting public and private agencies to promote PPAT work on sexual and reproductive health.

##### **2. Improving strategic plan and organizational development.**

PPAT conducted a planning, monitoring and evaluation of the research project to support PPAT works and strategic plan 2023 – 2027 to develop organizational efficiency in accordance with International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF)'s principles. In addition, PPAT also submitted 13 project proposals to local and international agencies to promote SRHR knowledge and service accessibility in all groups of populations. New technology has also been implemented to use within the organization, which is Accounting Software, to reduce paper use and connect finance and clinics' work more conveniently.

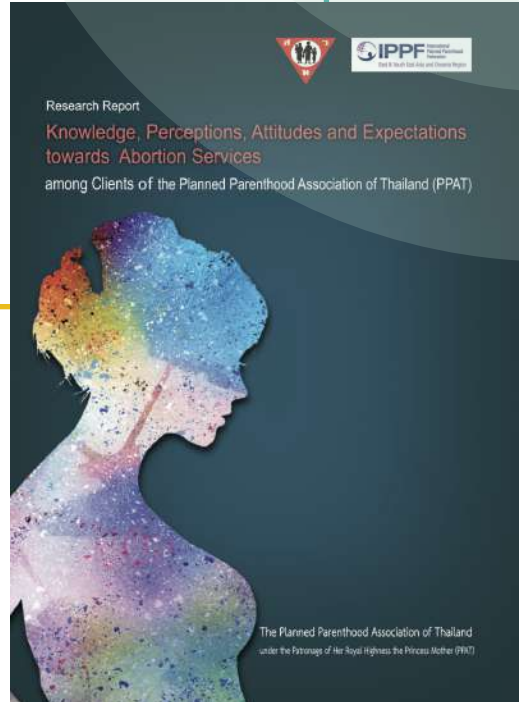
##### **4. Human Resources and Volunteers Capacities Enhancement.**

PPAT supported, in total of, 723 staff and volunteers to be equipped with SRHR knowledge and work-related technologies as well as constant knowledge and experience sharing activities for them to be skilled in implementing the project. Apart from this, PPAT also built a cooperation network from every sector which is part of the working mechanism wherein PPAT staff had joined the meeting, seminar, and training with public agencies and civil society organizations in both national and international levels.





The research project on the **Knowledge, Perception, Attitude and Experience towards Abortion in PPAT Clinic's Recipients** is a study of the recipients' knowledge, perceptions, attitudes and expectation on safe abortion care in PPAT 10 clinics in which the findings are used to improve service quality and channels, clinic information publication as well as integrate unplanned pregnancy factors data to be used in unplanned pregnancy prevention strategy through PPAT project.

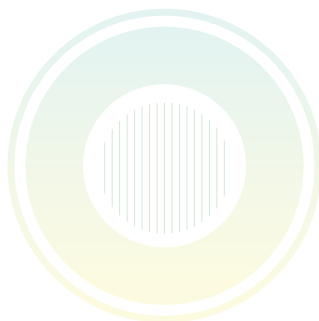

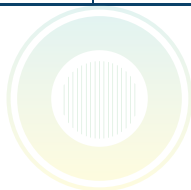
